THE HELP WANTED PREVENTION INTERVENTION BACKGROUND

- Sexual interest in children is a clear risk factor for child sexual abuse perpetration that few resources directly address
- Many people with sexual interest in children do not offend against children and often look for help
- Help Wanted is an online self-help curriculum with two primary goals
 - Prevent child sexual abuse
 - Reduce psychological stressors of help-seekers



HELP WANTED: THE PATHWAY TO PREVENTION

- Phase 1: Qualitative Interviews to develop well-grounded understanding of the needs of youth attracted to children.
- Phase 2: Intervention & Outreach Materials designed to destigmatize asking for help and providing help.
- Phase 3: Initial Evaluation and Feasibility Study to pilot the intervention.
- Phase 4: Randomized Clinical Trial to rigorously evaluate intervention efficacy.



HELP WANTED: MAJOR THEMES IN INTERVIEWS

- Recognition of attraction occurs in adolescence
- Difficulty in dealing with the meaning of their attraction, <u>not</u> necessarily keeping oneself from acting on attraction
- Need for resources for adolescents
- Scared of or unsure of how to find help/therapy
- Online community support is very important

ABSTRACT

Background: Adolescents and young adults with a sexual interest in young children represent an underserved population. The needs of this group, and their implications for child sexual abuse prevention program development, are not well understood.

Objective: The objective of this research is to advance knowledge about adolescents and young adults with a sexual interest in children to better inform the development of effective prevention and mental health efforts.

Participants and setting: The sample consisted of 30 young adults, ages 18-30, from North America, South America, Europe, and Australia.

Methods: Researchers conducted telephone interviews with participants, and asked about when their interest in children emerged, how they responded to this sexual interest, and what resources could have been helpful during this process. Participants also completed a brief, online survey. Interviews were transcribed and analyzed using Dedoose software.

Results: Participants reported that their sexual interest in children emerged during adolescence, and as part of that process, they experienced a variety of emotions, including fear, shame, and feelings of isolation. Participants also noted the need for role models who are sexually interested in children and successfully navigating life, positive messaging, and support from families and the community.

Conclusions: Young people with a sexual interest in children are largely hidden, vulnerable, and looking for help. Findings from this research can be used to direct the development of the prevention and mental health programs that are responsive to the needs of this community.

1. Introduction

Child sexual abuse remains a significant contributor to the global burden of disease (Krug, Mercy, Dahlberg, & Zwi, 2002; Mathers, Stevens, & Mascarenhas, 2009). In the United States (U.S.), approximately 15–25 % of girls and 5 % of boys experience child sexual abuse (Finkelhor, Shattuck, Turner, & Hamby, 2014), and the consequences of these experiences can be substantial. Child sexual abuse increases the likelihood of severe physical, mental, and behavioral health problems across the life course, as well as

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
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


- Our qualitative study served as the foundation to the remaining project phases


- Beta version of intervention released in May 2020

- Selected by Facebook and Google as a featured child sexual abuse prevention resource
- Selected for CDC funding in September 2020 to conduct a randomized waitlistcontrolled trial

IMPLICATIONS FOR HELPING PROFESSIONALS


- Consider barriers to therapy:
 - Need for trained therapists
 - Access to therapists
 - Cost
 - Confidentiality
- Structure therapy around wellness, not crime prevention
- Avoid language and perspectives that assume sexual abuse is inevitable
- Publicize your willingness to work with this population
- Think about public messaging (and ask for help!)

- Diverse faces, genders and relationships





